

MAGIC VIDEO TONES USER MANUAL

Magic Video Tones is an application that allows you to set video clip as an replacement for standard ringtone.



When there is incoming call instead of standard ringtone you see and hear video clip that is set up for the phone number (contact) that is calling you.

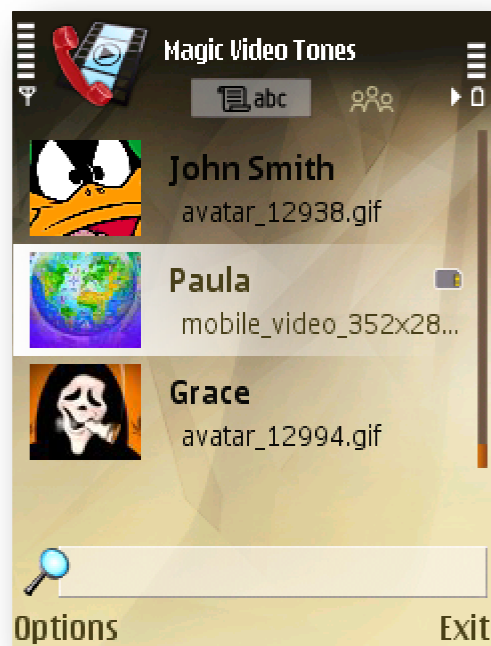
You can attach video clip to each contact separately. It is possible to attach video to contact's groups or even to unknown incoming calls.

Magic Video Tones application supports the following video formats:

- MPEG4 (MP4 files)
- Real Media (RM files),
- 3GPP (3GP files)
- Animated GIF.

Application main view consists of two pages:

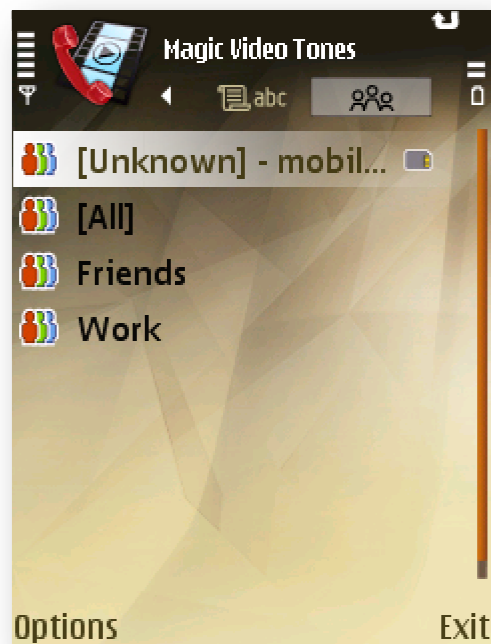
- **Contacts** – it shows list of all contacts that user provided in Phone's Contacts application. When you click on the entry you can choose and attach video to selected contact (The dialog box shows all supported video files (including GIF) stored in Phone and Mass Memory)



- **Groups** – it shows list of all groups that user defined in Phone's Contacts application. When you click on the entry you can choose and attach video to selected group (The dialog box shows all supported video files (including GIF) stored in Phone and Mass Memory) . There are also fixed entries: **[All]** – by attaching video clip to this entry you

add it to all contacts, and **[Unknown]** – by attaching video clip to this entry you define video that will be played when you have incoming call from phone number that is not stored in phone's contacts.

Once you attached video clip to group, you can switch to Contacts tab to see video clip thumbnails on each entry belonging to this group. (Of course [Unknown] group is an exception – it is virtual group representing unknown numbers)



The video clip can be easily previewed by choosing: **Options->Preview Video**.

You can detach the video clip from Contact / Group by selecting **Options->Remove Video** or by pressing 'C' button.

In **Options->Settings** you can define what to do when there is no audio track in video clip (please keep in mind that GIF files don't contain audio at all). The default behaviour is to **Play Original Ringtone** in this case.

On *Feature Pack 2* devices there is additional option: **Audio Preference**. You can choose to play original ringtone instead of audio track from video clip (**Ringtone over clip audio**) or to play video clip audio track (**Clip audio over ringtone**).

The last option in Settings: **Maintain aspect ratio** allows to play video clip scaled with maintained aspect ratio or with original size (may be clipped).
